**a. Combined revenues:** Combined Revenues Fiscal YTD are \$1.82M compared to \$931.3 thousand on Dec-23. An increase of \$893.7K year-on-year. Combined Expenses Fiscal YTD are \$766.8M compared to \$1.821 Mon Dec-23. A decrease of \$1.054M year-on-year. Combined Revenues for Dec-24 were \$610.9K compared to \$327K for Dec-23, an increase of \$283.9K. Meanwhile, expenses were \$357.3K and \$1.21M on Dec-24 and Dec-23, respectively. Total unallocated funds were \$22.24M for Dec-24.

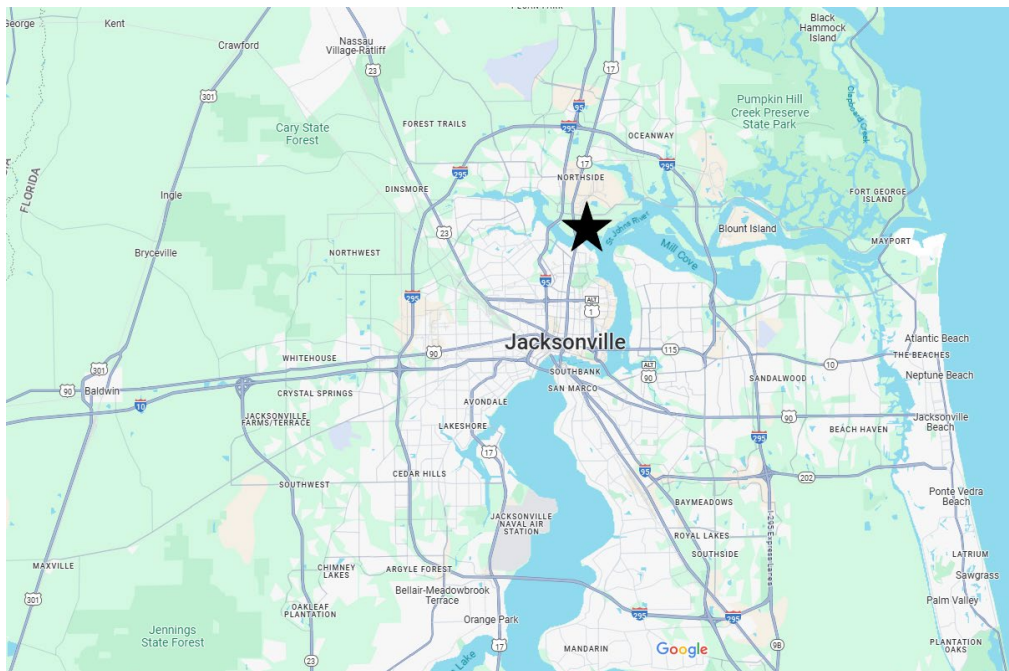

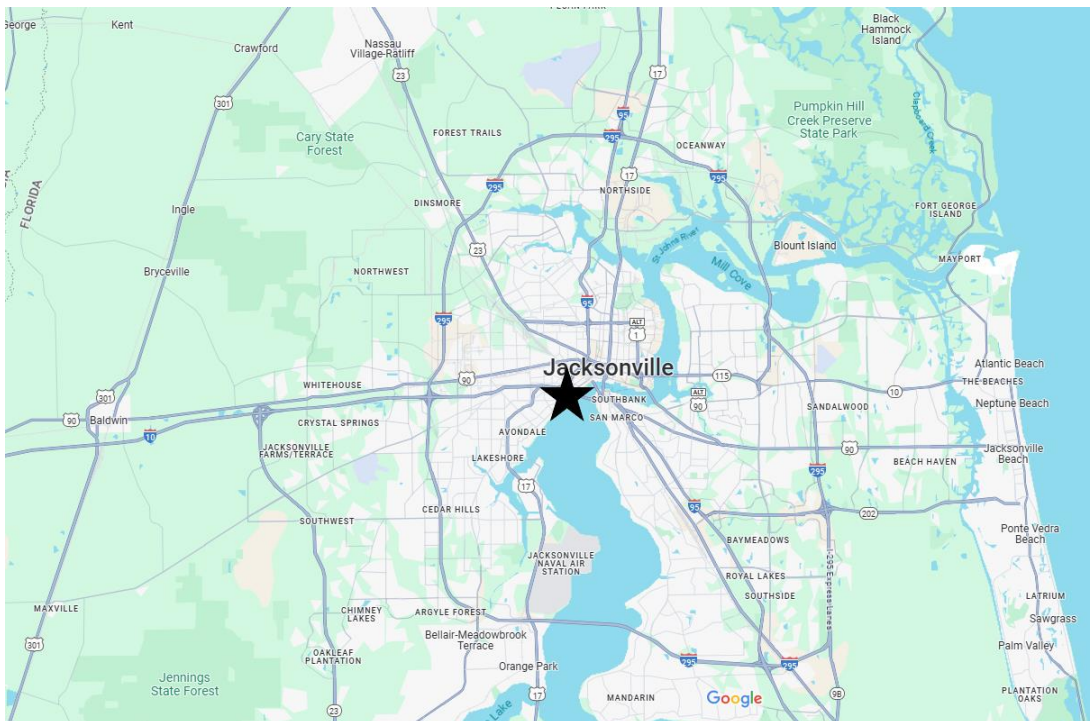

9 **Sec. 656.1206. - Permit procedure and criteria for tree removal,

12 (g) Protected trees identified for removal on the site clearing or  
13 tree removal permit application shall be replaced with new  
14 planted trees, unprotected trees or transplanted trees.  
15 Protected live oaks (*Quercus virginiana*) removed shall be  
16 replaced only with live oaks. The total caliper inches of  
17 replacement live oaks shall equal the total caliper inches of  
18 protected live oaks removed; for other removed protected trees,  
19 the total caliper inches of replacement trees shall equal one-  
20 third the total caliper inches removed. A waiver of this  
21 replacement requirement may be approved by the Chief if the  
22 tree removal was for the purpose of removing dead, diseased,

AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING LANDSCAPE AND TREE PROTECTION REGULATIONS; AMENDING SECTIONS 656.1206 (PERMIT PROCEDURE AND CRITERIA FOR TREE REMOVAL, RELOCATION AND REPLACEMENT OF PROTECTED TREES) AND 656.1208 (ENFORCEMENT OF THIS SUBPART B; VIOLATIONS AND PENALTIES; STOPPING WORK, CORRECTION OF VIOLATION, SETTLEMENT AND REDUCTION OF FINES PURSUANT TO POLICY CRITERIA; PROCEDURES), SUBPART B (TREE PROTECTION), PART 12 (LANDSCAPE AND TREE PROTECTION REGULATIONS), CHAPTER 656 (ZONING CODE), ORDINANCE CODE, TO ADDRESS CALCULATION OF TREE MITIGATION CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE TREE PROTECTION AND RELATED EXPENSES TRUST FUND AND MINIMUM CALIPER-INCH REQUIREMENTS FOR REPLACEMENT TREES IN KEEPING WITH PROVISIONS OF ARTICLE 25 OF THE CITY CHARTER, AND TO PROVIDE FOR AN AUTOMATIC INCREASE IN CONTRIBUTION CALCULATIONS WHEN THE COMBINED TOTAL OF UNALLOCATED FUNDS WITHIN THE TREE PROTECTION AND RELATED EXPENSES TRUST FUNDS IS BELOW \$5,000,000, OR AFTER SEPTEMBER 30, 2030, WHICHEVER OCCURS SOONER; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION INSTRUCTIONS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

1. Summary of the proposed ordinance (must include a statement of the public purpose, such as serving the public health, safety, morals, and welfare): This bill serves the public interest by reducing the minimum size of replacement trees required under Sections 656.1206(g)(4) and 656.1208(c)(2)(ii), *Ordinance Code*, from four-inch caliper to two-inch caliper, to mirror the minimum replacement tree as described in the Charter of Jacksonville, Article 25, Section 25.03(b). This bill reduces the amount of tree mitigation fees to be collected pursuant to Section 656.1206(g)(4), *Ordinance Code*, in effect to a flat fee of \$85 per caliper-inch of protected trees removed, a reduction of 55% over present day fees. This change in fee calculation mirrors the current language of the Charter of Jacksonville, Article 25, Section 25.03(c)(ii). This bill contains a clause to cause an automatic increase in tree mitigation contribution calculations upon the total of unallocated funds in the Tree Protection and Related Expenses Trust Funds, as described in Article 25 of the Jacksonville City Charter and in Section 111.760, *Ordinance Code*, is below \$5,000,000 or after September 30, 2030, whichever occurs sooner, to then read: for each caliper-inch, or fraction thereof, the contribution amount shall equal to the median wholesale price for a container grown two-inch caliper Live Oak, published by North Florida nurseries located within Duval, St. Johns, Clay, Baker and Nassau Counties, calculated as of October 1 of the prior calendar year, and thereafter to recalculated and adjusted annually on October first.
