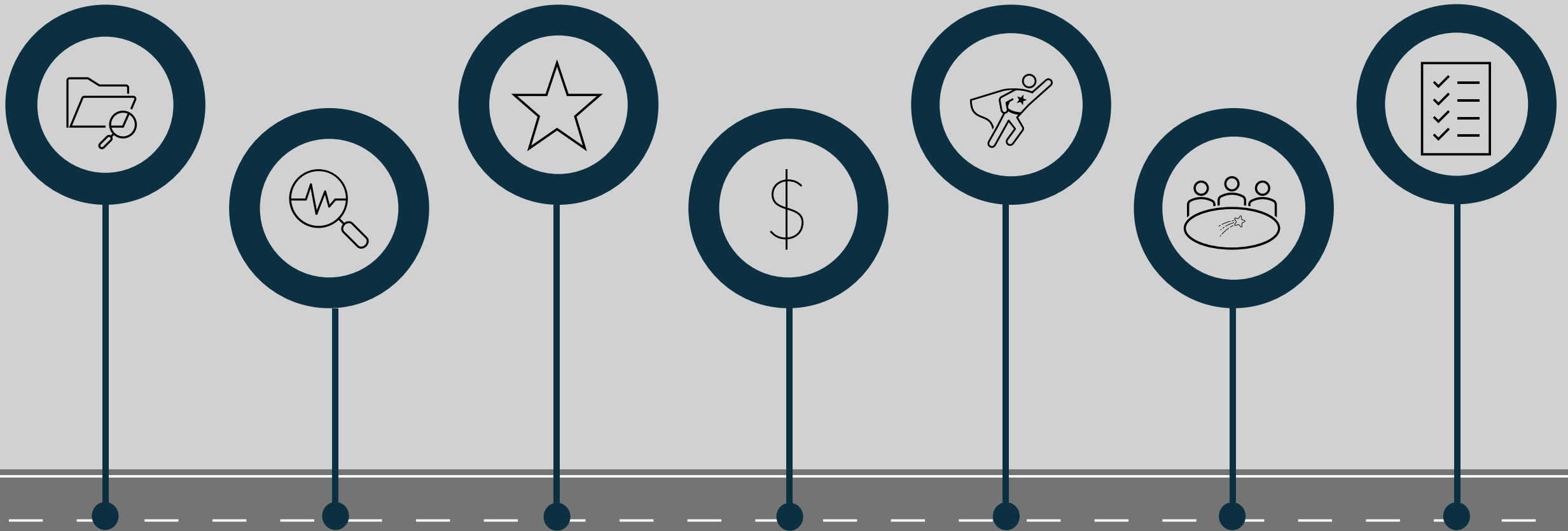

Best Practices

- Simplified grant applications and process
- Clear eligibility guidelines
- Be clear on who or what the funding is for
- Anonymized applications prior to scoring
- Feedback is provided on why a section was scored low to improve on future applications
- Multi-year grants
- Inclusion of general operating funds (or a percentage) in funding
- Promotion of community engagement and inclusion
- Scorers understand the impacted communities and their needs (expertise and experience)



Public Dollars and Public Need

Problem:

Clear identification Duval County's most vulnerable people and needs, and to seek stabilized budget allocations

Recommendations:

- Critically assessment of current needs assessment process
- Assess use of Chapter 126
- Recognize Mayor and City Council political priorities
- Include connecting MVPs to elected officials' priorities by working with the Office of Strategic Partnerships.



Applicants

Problem:

Complex process, perceived as unfair, difficult to navigate

Recommendations:

- Website
 - User-friendly
 - Multi-media
- Application Process
 - Streamlined
 - Database
 - Common application
 - Portal for nonprofits
 - Integrated with Nonprofit Gateway
- GuideStar integration/inclusion
- Critical Review of Application Sections
- Award Limits
- Trainings
 - Focus on application content
 - Videos for technical assistance
- Outreach
 - Increase community outreach
 - Increase broad engagement



Public Service Grants Council

Problem:

Retention of PSGC members

Recommendations:

- Articulate PSGC member responsibilities early
- Stress the skill sets and the time commitment
- Redesign PSGC trainings and workshops



Scoring

Problem:

Scoring of grants is inconsistent and perceived as benefiting better know, politically connected, and larger nonprofits

Recommendations:

- Specificity in MVPs and critical needs
- Structure and clarity in scoring rubric
- Required feedback for low scores
- Anonymized applications prior to scoring
