IV. Executive Director's Report

Timothy Johnson presented his Director's Report to the Advisory Committee, beginning with an update on the Annual Trustee Breakfast. He explained that the event had been rescheduled from September to October due to a hurricane, which ultimately proved beneficial by avoiding the busy city council budget season in September. As a result, the event had a higher turnout, with approximately 10 more RSVPs compared to previous years, making it a success.

Richard Reichard thanked Johnson for his leadership, noting that many more councilmembers were able to attend this year.

Johnson informed the committee that the PFPF Office received a Disability Pension Application last Friday, which would be on the December Advisory Committee agenda. He mentioned that the PFPF Medical Director's review was still pending and encouraged committee members to visit the PFPF Office to review the file before the meeting.

Michael Shell asked if a psychological doctor would also review the file, and Johnson confirmed that under the newly renegotiated contract, the Medical Director is required to subcontract with a psychologist to provide input on disability applications related to mental health issues. This current application review would include a psychological evaluation. Richard Reichard then asked if the application was complete aside from the Medical Director's review, to which Johnson confirmed that all necessary components had been received and the review should be completed shortly after Thanksgiving. The PFPF Office would notify the committee by email when the file was ready for review.

Thomas Lumpkin asked whether the 2.8% rate would continue for the Retiree Holiday Bonus and if both Police and Fire members would receive the same rate.

Steve Lundy responded that historically, the Police and Fire Unions have agreed on the same rate, which is 2.8% for this year. However, they could choose to set different rates if desired.

Lumpkin also took a moment to acknowledge Wendel H. Winko III, a retired Police Officer and former Police Trustee of the Police and Fire Pension Fund, who had recently passed away. He shared that Winko had called him a week before his passing to inquire about the state of the PFPF, showing his continued engagement and concern for the fund's health until the end. Lumpkin expressed appreciation for Winko's many years of dedicated service to both the PFPF and the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office.
