IV. Application for Disability Retirement – action requested

a. PIERRE, Marckenson

The Pension Staff, in collaboration with the Medical Director, finalized a disability pension application. Timothy Johnson presented the case to the Advisory Committee, outlining the application details and the Medical Director's determination that the disability is both permanent and total. Based on this assessment, the application satisfies the criteria for approval.

Richard Reichard moved to approve the Application for Disability Retirement, seconded by Jean Paravisini. The vote passed 4-2 with Michael Shell and Michael Pelletier voting against.

V. Executive Director's Report

Timothy Johnson informed the Advisory Committee about proposed enhancements to the Disability Pension Application process. These improvements include developing a more comprehensive form specifically designed for psychological medical professionals to review and complete. Additionally, he is working with the Medical Director to secure contracts with two additional psychological specialists to assist in reviewing disability pension applications.

Timothy Johnson also provided an update on the Joshua Livingood pension forfeiture case. The Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) has issued an opinion stating that the Local Ordinance conflicts with the State Statute, which requires either an admission or a finding of guilt to establish fraud. In contrast, the PFPF has applied the Local Ordinance standard, which does not require such admission or finding. The ALJ concluded that the PFPF Board of Trustees lacks the authority to determine fraud without an admission or finding of guilt and recommended closing the case. The Board of Trustees must decide this month whether to accept the ALJ's opinion or proceed with the forfeiture case.

Timothy Johnson also noted that he will present the 2025 PFPF Goals to the Advisory Committee in January.
