Successes: We ended the 2012-2013 school year with continuous learning and engaging/exciting activities!

During the Academic Hour, we continued to focus on reading comprehension and fluency. We utilized Duval County's Read It Forward Jax Super Six Reading Strategies. Our instructional focus is based on Read It Forward Jax Super Six Research-based Comprehension Strategies...Making Connections, Predict and Prove, Questioning, Summarize, Inference, and Visualization. We practice these strategies through Silent Sustained Reading, Teacher Read Alouds, Accelerated Reader Comprehension Quizzes, Compass Odyssey (2nd-5th), iReady Computer Program and Homework Assistance. This continuous practice during the fourth quarter will help prepare students for next year's grade levels and assessments.

Academic teachers continued to follow their schedule...providing 30 minutes of academic support and 30 minutes of homework assistance daily, Monday-Thursday, from 3:15-4:15.

We are continued to work hard toward our goal, provided by the Administrative Staff at Andrew Robinson: to help produce fluent, life-long readers. We also continued to develop the whole child, by working on individual goals and supporting talents and skills they already had and encouraging students to try new activities throughout the year. Students understood our theme well and left knowing they are never to young to prepare for a successful future: "Blasting Off to College Preparation...D.R.E.A.M. Big N.O.W.
