## Successes

- CIS TEAM UP has been awarded summer camp seats for youth at Fort Caroline from June 17 - July 19.

Academics:

- The Academic department is in the final push toward the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test, which will occur mid April. Our total focus is on reading and math strategies that will help students excel and raise FCAT scores
- The reading department at Fort Caroline Middle has provided the TEAM UP academic teachers with specific school wide strategies that will be used in TEAM UP to enhance learning
- Students needing extra tutoring are afforded that opportunity on Fridays, and through our Compass Odyssey Teacher provided to TEAM UP through DCPS.

Enrichment:

- Enrichment department welcomes two new staff members, a dance instructor and security personnel to assist with student safety.
- Enrichment time is looked forward to by all students as a time to relax after rigorous learning all day. Students still have choices as to which activities they would like to participate in.


## Challenges:

Our challenges are:

- Our school computers have been removed in anticipation of receiving new computers, but in the meantime TEAM UP does not have access to computers for student use. Despite these challenges, academics will continue to provide quality instruction to students with limited resources.
