Academics:

• All grades are intensely involved with strategies that should produce positive results with FCAT testing. This includes: site words, main idea, answer elimination, underling key words, scanning, check and recheck.

Enrichment:

- Lake Forest staff has decided to feature some unique programming to assist students that are in need of help. The Program is called the LFLBAS (Lake Forest Little Brothers and Sisters). This activity gives those students one on one help with school work from staff and older peers. This also makes a positive influence in their life.
- We also had **JUICY LOVE MUSIC** come in to perform for the students to promote positive motivation for the FCAT.
