## Successes:

- Lake Forest TEAM UP will host a TEAM UP Summer Camp from June $17^{\text {th }}$ through July $19^{\text {th }}$ for grade K-5. More than 100 youth have applied

Academics:

- Primary grades are working on ramp-up activities that prepare them for the next grade levels, such as multiplication in 2 digits, addition using 2 digits as well as substation using 2 digits. Students are also doing major place value prep for the next grade level.
- Students in grade $3^{\text {rd }}-5^{\text {th }}$ have been working on engaging beginning and how to grab a reader with simile and metaphors. All students are working on a writing piece with different topics that the students want to publish. Also working on long division for the upcoming year.

Enrichment:

- Lake Forest Elementary presented the first annual TEAM UP Sports Banquet. This banquet honored the students that have participated in various intramural sporting events throughout the school year. The event was attended by teachers, parents and students
- Students participated in the CSX Safety Poster Contest
- The staff hosted a year pep rally to showcase all of the activities that are offered in the TEAM UP program to the day school students


## Challenges:

- The ADA was reduced at the beginning of the year which forced us to reduce the number of youth served. The program served 154 students on an average daily basis. This presented some hardships on staffing the program and reduced the amount of money that could be spent on program supplies and field trips
- The challenges are minimal at this time. We are thankful for the support of parents that have provided encouragement and additional resources since the beginning of school in September. We are also appreciative of

How Well?

- $95 \%$ of academic staff are certified teachers. 100\% = $\mathbf{1 1}$ teachers out of 11 are certified teachers
- Agency will maintain at least $97 \%$ of projected ADA. The program achieve and average daily attendance of 154 which is equal to $103 \%$
- Staff to student ratio $1: 18$ or better. The program maintained this goal at 18 students in each academic and enrichment activity.

Anybody Better Off?
- $98 \%$ of students attending Jacksonville Journey TEAM UP sites for 60 days or more will be free from physical harm
and arrest. -Objective met $100 \%=176$ of students attending for 60 days or more were not arrested and remained free from physical harm. (School baseline 99\% 1 out of 447 students was arrested, class 3)
- $90 \%$ of students attending Jacksonville Journey TEAM UP sites for 60 days or more will be promoted to the next grade level. -Objective met 96\%/7 out of 176 students were retained. (School baseline 93\% = 32 out of 447 students were retained)
- $90 \%$ of students attending Jacksonville TEAM UP sites for 60 days or more will be absent from school less than 21 days. -Objective met 99\%/1of 176 (School Baseline $97 \% 437$ out of 447 students were absent from school less than 21 days)
- $90 \%$ of students attending Jacksonville Journey TEAM UP sites for 60 days or more will not receive a Class 3 or 4 referral/conduct violation. -Objective met 100\% = $\mathbf{1 7 6}$ students that attended 60 days or more. (School baseline, 99\% 1 out of 447 received a class 3 referral)
- $60 \%$ of students attending on a regular basis will attend TEAM UP for 60 days or more -Objective met $\mathbf{7 9 \%}=\mathbf{1 7 6}$ out of 223 attended TEAM UP on a regular basis
