Academics:							
 Fifth grade students are focusing on Main Idea, as well as long division. Students are being pulled by teachers and recreational staff to work with the students that are having difficulties in these areas. 							
 Forth grade students are preparing for 2 digit times tables and one digit multiplication. Students are also functioning on reading context clues and choosing the correct reading strategy. 							
• Students in the third grade are working on ma	• Students in the third grade are working on main idea also and basic multiplication facts in math.						
• Second grade students are dealing with subtraction in math across zeros. Second grade are using context clues by using text to go back and find answers.

Enrichment:

- Students and Enrichment staff at Lake Forest Elementary received pumpkins as a math project to see how much the pumpkin weighed with seeds and without, then later craved the pumpkins.

Challenges:

- Integrating the young ladies into the physical sports
- The program is currently at capacity and finding it challenging to render quality programming with reduced funding. The program has had to reduce all areas with the exception of staffing.
