These programs are housed in elementary and middle schools, and provide services directly after school for approximately 3 hours per day, five days per week.

On January 2nd Ms.Laurie Bourdon from DCPS conducted a TEAM UP Academic observation in which the program received the highest score in all categories. Ms.Bourdon remarks were very encouraging to the program, they ensured us that we are on the right track for success! The TEAM UP 5th grade chorus students gave a outstanding performance at the Community Connections Annual Board Meeting. The students learned the importance of contributions and funding sources that support organizations to provide healthy learning environments for students to attend . Also the TEAM UP program was overwhelmed with the arrival of TEAM UP new art Instructor Mr.George Miller. Each grade level will have their own art project to complete and as a special assignment students will create masks for Mardi Gras.

Challenges

With F-CAT and FAIR testing only weeks away, some of the parents have removed their children from TEAM UP and hired private tutors hoping that the students would do better on the exams than in previous years. The TEAM UP program and Principal Brown are working together during the academic hour of the program by adding additional teachers to tutor with the help of SAI funds through DCPS and meeting with parents to inform them of the importance of the students remaining in the program.
