Successes:

- Members of Keystone Club discussed how to raise awareness of the homeless here in Jacksonville. They realized
 that people need to be exposed to the issue. They developed the Homelessness Project. They have planned a lock
 in at one of our community based sites. The night will be made up of different activities to bring understanding of
 what it is like to be homeless. They will have guest speakers, and learn about such topics as safety on the streets,
 meeting medical needs while homeless, etc. They event will occur in April.
- Members of the dance troop started to learn the history of stepping. The have begun to design their own routines.
- Members of Street S.M.A.R.T. learned about conflict this month. They explored the different ways conflicts arise, along with developing conflict resolution skills.
- Members of Career Launch took a day off from their spring break to visit the McCann Law Group. Members had the opportunity to explore careers in law, accounting, human resources and marketing.
- On March 8^{th,} members visited the Ritz Theater and Museum. They learned the history of the site and learned that the goal of the Museum is to research, record and preserve the material and artistic culture of African American life in Northeast Florida. The original Theater built in 1929 was known as the "Harlem of the South."
