Program Summary: TEAM UP is an after school program that provides academic instruction, tutoring and support, as well as, enrichment activities, such as field trips, dance, sports and arts to low income at risk kids. These programs are housed in elementary and middle schools, and provide services directly after school approximately 3 hours per day, five days per week.

Successes:

- Keystone Club members completed their "Homelessness Project" on Friday April 5th. They turned our NFL YET Club into a Homeless Shelter and invited other Keystone Club members from our other sites to join them. A total of 48 members participated. They created shelters out of cardboard boxes, learned about safety on the streets, and the laws regarding the homeless. Meals replicated those served at local shelters.
- Keystone Club members also took a trip to Tallahassee to visit and tour Florida State University (FSU). They learned about the application process, and how to receive money, to help pay for college, along with information about majors and services available at FSU.
- Passport to Manhood members learned how gangs recruit, and they discussed the consequences of joining a gang.
 They also developed skills to resist the influence of gang recruiters and other peer pressure.
- Members of S.M.A.R.T. Girls learned about "labels" and how they are used to hurt others and can lower a person's self-confidence. Members enhanced their skills to increase their self-awareness and self-confidence.
