If owners fail to address unsafe structure and/or nuisance issues, provided funding assists with demolition and site clearance activities to correct code violations. DART (Drug Abatement Response Team): MCCD partners with Jacksonville Sheriff's Office, in addition to Jacksonville Fire and Rescue Division, Animal Care and Control, J.E.A., Community Services, and the Office of General Counsel, to inspect properties where reported criminal activity(-ies) occur. During DART "hits" or projects, MCCD may deem a structure as unsafe and subsequently condemn it; if negligent owners fail to correct violations, the city may ultimately arrange for abatement via demolition and/or heavy debris site clearance of nuisance conditions.
