



PROCLAMATION

ONE CITY. ONE JACKSONVILLE.

WHEREAS: The DONNA Foundation was launched in 2003 to raise funds and support those in Northeast Florida living with breast cancer; and

WHEREAS: Over the last twenty years, the foundation has helped more than 17,000 families in their fight against breast cancer. Through fundraising events, the foundation has contributed more than \$3.3 million towards groundbreaking breast cancer research; and

WHEREAS: In 2022, the foundation served almost 2,000 citizens living with breast cancer, a 24% increase from previous years; and

WHEREAS: Started in 2007, the DONNA Foundation has hosted the DONNA Marathon, a race whose proceeds go directly to breast cancer research and supporting individuals in the community living with breast cancer; and

WHEREAS: Over the last sixteen years, the DONNA Marathon has grown into a weekend of events, including a 1-mile dash, 5K, Half-Marathon, Full Marathon, and 110 Mile Ultra Marathon; and

WHEREAS: More than 10,000 runners and walkers from across the country participate in the DONNA Marathon Weekend, bringing in thousands of dollars for breast cancer research, and elevating Jacksonville to the forefront of the fight against breast cancer.


And hereby proclaim February 3 – 5, 2023 as
