

# SEPARATING YOUR DEBRIS



**DEBRIS SEPARATION:** Separate debris into the four categories shown below.

**WHERE TO PLACE DEBRIS:** Debris should be placed curbside, without blocking the roadway or storm drains. If you don't have a sidewalk, ditch or utility line in front of your house, place debris at the edge of your property before the curb.

**DO NOT STACK AGAINST OR LEAN:** Placing debris near or on mailboxes, poles, or other structures makes removal difficult. This includes fire hydrants and meters. Place debris at least 3 feet away from all obstacles.

**PLEASE NOTE: Tree contractors are required by law to haul away the debris.**  
**NO PICKUP ZONE. Any debris placed from the sidewalk toward your property will not be picked up.**

## CONSTRUCTION & DEMOLITION DEBRIS

Building Materials • Carpet • Drywall  
Fencing • Furniture • Lumber • Mattresses  
Plumbing • Sandbags



## VEGETATIVE DEBRIS

Leaves • Logs • Plants • Tree Branches  
- Bag leaves for weekly pick-up (5 cubic yards/30 bags)  
- Pile for special collections, which begin 9/25/17  
- Do not put vegetative debris in city issued trash or recycling carts



## ROUTINE HOUSEHOLD WASTE

Routine household waste and bagged vegetative debris will not be picked up with disaster debris. You should continue to follow your normal waste collection schedule.

**DO NOT BURN DEBRIS AND YARD WASTE.** Burning storm debris is a violation of Jacksonville's year-round Burn Ban. Citizens can report this violation to 630-CITY(2489) by phone, or online at [630city.coj.net](http://630city.coj.net).
